

The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health and OSHA have collaborated to update OSHA's original Heat Safety Tool. The updated app, available for both <u>Android</u> and <u>iPhone</u>, provides a clearer user interface, while still providing the same information to help keep workers safe when working outdoors in hot weather. Extreme heat causes more deaths than any other weather-related hazard; each year <u>more than 65,000</u> people seek medical treatment for extreme heat exposure.
